The Labor Hall of Fame honors Judy Calhoun



Judy Wyrick Calhoun was born February 19,1954 in Carlsbad, New Mexico. She graduated high school and went on to earn her degree in education. Following that, Judy went to nursing school and earned her degree as a Registered Nurse. Sadly after 40 plus years of dedication to the Oklahoma Labor Movement, the Democratic Party, her Community, Family and Friends, Judy passed away unexpectedly on December 16, 2020.

Judy started her career at the General Motors plant in Oklahoma City in 1979 and became a member of UAW Local 1999. Shortly thereafter she became a member of the Local's Women's Committee. Over the years, she served UAW Local 1999 in many capacities, as Trustee, Recording Secretary, Financial Secretary, and Chair of the CAP Committee. Judy also held the position of Chair of the Oklahoma UAW State CAP Council for many years and served as their lobbyist.

When the GM plant closing was announced in November 2005, Judy spearheaded the effort to keep the plant open by bringing in

another product. After production ceased at the plant in February 2006, she remained an active member until the local union office closed in April 2010. Judy was then appointed by the International UAW as Benefit Representative for UAW Region 5 Retirees, which she served in this position until the UAW Region 5 office closed. Not skipping a beat, she carried on with the UAW Local 1999 Retiree Chapter where she was elected as Financial Secretary, and prior to her passing was elected Vice President of the Southwestern States UAW CAP Council.

A tireless champion for working women's rights, Judy was a founding member of the Greater Oklahoma City Chapter, Coalition of Labor Union Women (CLUW), elected as First Vice President in 2016. When their president had to take leave for personal matters, she assumed the role of Interim President and remained in that position until her untimely death.

Judy was a life-long loyal Democrat and well known in the Oklahoma Democratic Party. She served on the Oklahoma Democratic Party Central Committee from 2001 to 2019, was Vice Chair of the Fourth Congressional District for the 2007-2009 term and served as Secretary in other years. She was a Delegate to the Democratic National Convention in 2004, 2008, 2012 and 2016, and an active member of the Oklahoma Federation of Democratic Women and the Southside Oklahoma City Democratic Women's Club.

Among her many accomplishments, Judy was appointed to the Workers' Compensation Advisory Committee by Governor Walters in 1995, received the I.A.F.F. "Distinguished Achievement" Award in 1995, the O.D.P. "Chairman's" Award in 2005, the O.F.D.W.C. "Outstanding Democratic Woman of the Year" Award in 2013, the "Spirit of the Community" Award in 2014 and the "Civilian of the Year" Award in 2019.

The Labor Hall of Fame honors Tony DeGiusti



Anthony David DeGiusti was born January 4, 1949, in Oklahoma City. Tony attended Oklahoma City Public Schools southside schools starting with Columbus Elementary, Jackson Junior High and then graduating in 1967 from Capitol Hill High School. In 1968 he went on to attend the University of Oklahoma where he received a B.A. in History, and then in 1978 received a master's degree in journalism.

Tony started teaching for Oklahoma City Public Schools in 1972. Shortly thereafter he became an active union member of AFT Local 2309. Holding true to his southside upbringing, Tony spent his entire teaching career in Oklahoma City Public Schools, where he taught Social Studies. He was affectionately known as "Mr. D" to his 8th grade students at Roosevelt Middle School.

In 1979 Tony was one of more than 1,000 teachers in Oklahoma City who risked losing their jobs to make their voices heard for higher pay, fair treatment and to protest the lack of educational

materials and poor building conditions. Tony proudly "Walked the Line in '79" with his colleagues when Oklahoma City AFT went on strike. He served as Picket Line Captain in the only true teacher strike in Oklahoma history.

After the teachers' strike in 1979, Tony became even more active in the union. He served as the AFT worksite leader at Roosevelt Middle School and was the first Field Representative for OKC-AFT from 1981-1987. Tony also served his local as 2nd Vice President, Trustee and as an Executive Board member throughout his union career. During a dark period for AFT 2309 in 1988, Tony stepped up and served as President of the Union. With his leadership, AFT was able to continue as the bargaining agent for Oklahoma City teachers. That same year, he entered law school at Oklahoma City University.

After graduating with a Juris Doctorate from OCU in 1992, Tony continued his union advocacy by representing teachers in grievances, at conferences with administration, at school board hearings, at the State Department of Education, and in court, not only for OKC-AFT but also for AFT locals throughout the state. From 2003 to 2013 Tony held the position of Chief Legal Counsel for OKC-AFT. In his retirement he continued to serve OKC-AFT by writing wills for teachers, a free service to members.

Among his many accomplishments, Tony was the No. 1 AFT 2309 Activist from 1973 to 2003 and recipient of the Mike Barlow "Union Teacher of the Year" award for 1996-1997.






