
WOMEN'S COMMITTEE

I've been a CAP donor for decades because I've seen first-hand how the political process works.

It seems that each day there's some kind of "bombshell report" coming from the extreme factions of political parties. The daily deluge of information is sometimes hard to digest. Our Local CAP Committee seeks to sift through the noise and take an honest look at our candidates for office. In the past we have come together to support both republicans and democrats, if an independent best shares our values and beliefs, then we will show our support. There is no strength in division.
