RE: GM Profits/Profit Sharing – 2023 North America – Earnings Before Income Tax (EBIT)

Greetings:

Today, General Motors announced North America Earnings Before Income Tax (EBIT) for 2023 to be \$12.3 billion.

In accordance with the terms of the 2023 UAW-GM National Agreement, each eligible member will receive up to a \$12,250 payout for 2023 Profit Sharing. These contractual payments will be made on Friday, February 23, 2024.

As always, our membership performed beyond all expectations. It is our members' skillfulness that made this profit possible, as they produce the finest products in the world, right here in the U.S.A.

DID YOU KNOW...

On June 23, 1963, Dr. Martin Luther King, along with numerous Detroit church leaders, Mayor Jerome Cavanagh and UAW President Walter Reuther, led a march down Woodward Avenue to protest unequal treatment of Black people both around the country and in Detroit. Police estimates placed the crowd that marched between 125,000 and 200,000, making it the largest civil rights demonstration in the United States at that time.

The march culminated with a program of

speakers and musical performances at Cobo Arena, where over 20,000 people, along with many others gathered outside listening to loud speakers, heard King present remarks that foreshadowed his famous "I Have a Dream"



CAP CONFERENCE JANUARY 21-25, WASHINGTON DC

"2024 is a very important election year". This is something we hear every election year, so why should this year be any different?
